Overview of Priority 1 Submitted Projects € 1.141.320.156,29 Total eligible budget of submitted projects: Priority 1 - A more competitive and smarter Europe This Priority features Calls for Projects for SMEs, clusters, Smart Specialisation Parks and the private sector, in collaboration with public and academic counterparts. Tender 131.B -Increasing the competitiveness of SMEs in the Northwest Development Region - saw a high uptake with 470 submissions, highlighting the signed contracts program's private sector appeal. 131.A:273 131.B:470 121:278 111:24 131.D:41 131.... 112:34

Start-ups need European funding to turn their ideas into innovative solutions. The tender dedicated for newly created companies is a crucial support for 34 entrepreneurs who have submitted their best projects with a great potential to bring an impact to the community, eligible for a grant of up to €1.5 million each. The North-West Development Region will thus benefit from the €22 million that these start-ups will invest in research, development and innovation.

The 6 contracts signed so far total almost €9.3 million and over the next 3-4 years they will generate tangible results for both the North-West region and the European innovation sector.

Submitted Projects

Total eligible budget of submitted projects:

Priority 3 - A greener Europe involves tenders targeting energy efficiency in housing, public buildings (including heritage sites), and renewable energy in rural areas. It also supports green cities and improved urban green infrastructure. The most active calls were 311.A -Increasing energy efficiency in the region as part of investments in the housing sector (49 projects) and **312.A** - Supporting energy efficiency in public buildings, including heritage buildings (39 projects).

The Administrative Palace of Maramureş County will be modernized with an investment of almost **€30 million** under the North-West Regional Programme 2021-2027.

The residents of Baia Mare, especially the employees of the Administrative Palace, will benefit from a significantly modernized building. The project aims to transform the building into an energy efficient one by reducing annual energy consumption by almost **90%**. In this way, the Administrative Palace will become a model of sustainability through the use of renewable energy sources.

By completely modernizing the heating, ventilation and lighting systems, the building will provide a healthier and more comfortable working environment for employees. It will also install 16 charging points for electric vehicles, which will enable travel in an environmentally friendly and community-centric way. In the long term, this project contributes to a cleaner city by reducing pollution and lowering gas and electricity bills.



Total eligible budget of submitted projects: Priority 4 - A more Greener Europe encompasses tenders aimed at promoting the use of public transport and other environmentally friendly urban mobility solutions. Despite having only two active calls, this priority has garnered significant community interest, with a total of 79 projects submitted. Of these, 46 were submitted for Call 481.B - Increased use of public transport and other forms of environmentally friendly urban mobility (Urban Mobility), while the remaining 27 projects were for Call 481.A - Increased use of other public transport and forms of environmentally friendly urban mobility (Urban Mobility) in County Municipalities.

Priority 4 takes a significant step forward with the signing of **22** crucial contracts. These contracts pave the way for improved urban mobility infrastructure in the benefiting cities.

The city of Aleşd makes the transition to green transport with an investment of more than €10 million under the North-West Regional Programme 2021-2027.

The project aims to reduce CO_2 emissions and provide residents with clean and accessible means of transportation. Further investments include the creation of almost **9.5 km of sidewalks and bike lanes** to make walking and cycling more comfortable and safe for everyone. In addition, **20 bicycles** will be available for rent from two key points in the city, which will become an easy alternative to car transportation.

The development of more than **14,000** square meters of green space and the planting of hundreds of trees contribute not only to the beauty of the city, but also to cleaner air and a more quieter environment. The health of the citizens will also be improved by reducing the effects of pollution. In addition to a cleaner and healthier city, Aleşd aligns itself with the European vision for a sustainable future and a greener lifestyle. This project is an essential step towards an environmentally friendly city, which will be achieved by its completion in **February 2029**.

Total eligible budget of submitted projects:

Priority 5 - A more Connected Europe is targeting both infrastructure and safety. Upgrades to secondary roads, including key TEN-T connections, are a focus. With 4 active tenders, the most significant interest has been seen in Call 521 - Construction/Rehabilitation of Secondary Road Links to the Road Network and TEN-T Nodes, with 6 projects submitted, followed by Call 522.A - Equipment to Increase Traffic Safety, with 6 submitted projects.

The County Council of Bistrița-Năsăud will invest over **€130 million** in modernizing their county roads through the North-West Regional Programme 2021-2027.

For the **93,000** inhabitants that drive on the county road DJ151, this project will make the road be up to European standards. For almost **77 km** of the county road investments will be made and this will mean that the road will be straightened and widened where necessary, the basic road structures and bridges will be rebuilt, and sidewalks or access paths will be widened for pedestrians. More than **15 km of sidewalks** will be provided with **31 video-monitored** pedestrian crossings and almost **11 km of bicycle lanes** to serve citizens who choose to use these roads.

Road safety will improve through new or rehabilitated elements such as 7 bridges, **371** culverts and **28** stations for intracounty transportation. For electric vehicles, **8** fast-charging stations are planned in green spaces which will also protect the environment. The long term effect of this infrastructure project is that the number of users of these roads will reach up to **40 million** passengerkilometers/year, which demonstrates the need for regional mobility.

Total eligible budget of submitted projects:

Priority 6 - A more social and inclusive Europe involves tenders aimed at enhancing educational infrastructure across various levels, from early childhood to university education, and at modernizing school facilities. The most active call is **621.A** - Educational infrastructure at the early education level - pre-school (nurseries) and pre-school (kindergartens), that garnered **23** projects. This is followed by **621.B** - Educational infrastructure for primary and secondary education - theoretical and vocational stream, with **14** submitted projects.

The call for projects 623 - Development of educational infrastructure in university education has secured **6** signed contracts, underscoring the academic community's interest in advancing their infrastructure for future development.

The University of Agricultural Sciences and Veterinary Medicine of Cluj-Napoca is modernizing its infrastructure with an investment of almost **€9 million** under the North-West Regional Programme 2021-2027.

More than 1,400 undergraduate students, 180 PhD students and 200 teaching staff at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine will benefit from a modernized teaching and learning environment. The building will be rehabilitated and extended by another 4,000 square meters. The project will create new teaching spaces, including 24 laboratories, 3 lecture halls and 5 seminar rooms, all equipped with modern equipment to meet current market needs.

A major objective of the project is to create an accessible and inclusive educational environment. The building will be adapted for easy access for people with disabilities. In addition, energy efficiency systems based on renewable energy sources will be implemented to support the sustainable development of the university. In addition to the educational benefits, the project will contribute in the long term to the training of new generations of veterinary professionals dedicated to animal care. Overview of

Total eligible budget of submitted projects:

Priority 7 - A Europe close to its citizens involves tenders promoting integrated and inclusive development across social, economic, and environmental domains, as well as culture, natural heritage, sustainable tourism, and security in non-urban areas. The most active tender is **714.B** - Urban Regeneration and Security of Public Spaces, with 51 submitted projects. Additionally, call for projects **711** -Conservation, Protection, and Sustainable and Competitive Enhancement of Cultural and Historical Heritage, including ensuring and/or improving access to them in urban areas, has garnered 24 submitted projects.

The city of Zalău will revitalize an abandoned area through an **€11 million** contract within the North-West Regional Programme 2021-2027.

The residents will benefit from a completely regenerated urban space that will transform more than **34,000** square meters of degraded land into an attractive, safe and safe area full of modern facilities. Almost **67,000** citizens will have access to new green spaces, pedestrian trails, bicycle paths and relaxation areas designed for all ages. The new urban spaces include children's playgrounds and sports fields, which will give everyone a place to improve their wellbeing.

TO keep the community safe, a video surveillance system and modern street lighting will be installed, along with free Wi-Fi access points. The project includes extensive work to demolish old structures, redevelop the grounds and create an automated irrigation system to keep the green spaces attractive all year round.
