
Out of the **100** contracts secured through this priority, **13** pertain to the **Smart Specialisation Parks**, while the remaining **87** support the **private sector**.

Tender 121 - Digitalization of SMEs in the North-West Development Region - saw a high uptake with 477 submissions, highlighting the program's private sector appeal.

The town of Tășnad in Satu Mare County is stepping into the future of innovation-led development with the launch of its first Smart Specialisation Park, backed by over €4.4 million in funding from the North-West Regional Programme 2021-2027. Developed by Primăria Tășnad, the project aims to transform a currently underused area into a fully equipped site for future-oriented business investments. The new park will include access roads, utility networks, and all necessary infrastructure to accommodate at least five high-value private investments by 2030.

Beyond its physical footprint, the park is designed to stimulate at least four innovation partnerships between companies and research or academic institutions, reinforcing the town's role in the regional knowledge economy. Tășnad's initiative joins a growing network of parks specialisation across the North-West strategically planned to boost local competitiveness and economic diversification. In total, 17 such projects have already been programme, under the current with a investment value exceeding €106 million.

Scheduled for completion by **January 2028**, the Smart Specialisation Park in Tășnad is more than just infrastructure, it's a commitment to a smarter, greener, and more resilient local economy.



This priority marches for a greener Europe. It involves tenders targeting energy efficiency in housing, public buildings (including heritage sites), and renewable energy in rural areas. It also supports green cities and improved urban green infrastructure.

Out of the 25 signed contracts of this priority, 10 contracts are for urban infrastructure and 15 contracts for energy efficiency in public buildings.

The most active calls relate to increasing energy efficiency in the region as part of investments in the housing sector and supporting energy efficiency in public buildings, including heritage buildings.



The historical building of the "Mihai Eminescu National College" in Oradea (Bihor county) will undergo extensive renovation to improve energy performance, thanks to a signed contract of over €19.8 million. The project targets one of the city's landmark educational and heritage buildings and aims to reduce energy consumption while improving the comfort and safety of users. The renovation will deliver a 80% reduction in annual primary energy consumption and a 95% cut in greenhouse gas emissions compared to current levels. The works include thermal insulation, improved heating and ventilation systems, the use of renewable energy sources, and the integration of smart energy management technologies. Over 300,000 kWh/year of energy will be supplied from renewable sources.


Covering a surface of nearly **10,000 square meters**, the building serves students and teaching staff for at least 12 hours a day throughout most of the year. Beyond environmental benefits, the investment enhances air quality, indoor comfort and long-term usability of this cultural heritage site.


Scheduled for completion in **February 2029**, this project is a strong example of how EU cohesion policy supports energy efficiency in public infrastructure while preserving cultural identity in less-developed regions.





This priority marches for a greener Europe. It encompasses tenders aimed at promoting the use of public transport and other environmentally friendly urban mobility solutions. Despite having only two active calls, this priority has garnered significant community interest, taking a significant step forward with the signing of 35 crucial contracts. These contracts pave the way for improved urban mobility infrastructure in the benefiting cities.





A new sustainable urban mobility project is underway in Cluj-Napoca (Cluj County), where a major investment is being made to reconstruct the Garibaldi Bridge, a key connection across the Someşul Mic river. With a total budget of over €12 million, the project aims to improve multimodal connectivity between two of the city's most dynamic areas, while promoting the use of public and active transport.

The new bridge will feature **four lanes** for public transport and private vehicles, dedicated cycling infrastructure **(250 metres)**, and pedestrian walkways **(430 metres)**, fully integrated into the city's smart traffic management system. The intervention also includes modernised intersections, new access routes, and public lighting. **Two electric** charging stations will be installed to support clean mobility.

The project targets over **50,000 residents** and aims to cut CO₂ emissions by **2,958 tonnes** annually. More than **3.5 million public transport users** and **1.7 million cyclists per year** are expected to benefit from improved accessibility between residential areas, major sports venues, and the city centre. Set for completion in **December 2026**, the new Garibaldi Bridge will strengthen urban links, enhance safety and efficiency, and support the transition to a climate-neutral transport network in Romania's fastest-growing city.








This priority is targeting both infrastructure and safety. Upgrades to secondary roads, including key TEN-T connections, are a focus. With 4 active tenders, the most significant interest has been seen in Call 522.A - Equipment to Increase Traffic Safety, with 8 projects submitted, followed by Call 521 - Construction / Rehabilitation of Secondary Road Links to the Road Network and TEN-T Nodes, with 6 submitted projects.

13 contracts, three for road safety infrastructure, four for road safety equipment and six for road infrastructure have been secured under this priority.





The Municipality of Cluj-Napoca (Cluj County) is making a decisive investment in sustainable urban mobility and traffic safety through the construction of a state-of-the-art road underpass. With a total budget of €26 million, this project is a key component of the city's broader strategy to foster a more efficient, resilient, and accessible transport network.

This strategic investment will deliver **275 meters** of underpass infrastructure, alongside the modernization of **444 meters** of tram tracks to enhance multimodal transport options. The project also prioritizes pedestrian and cyclist safety, incorporating **4,300 square meters** of upgraded sidewalks, **30 newly** planted trees, and **342 square** meters of dedicated public transport waiting areas.

To further **optimize mobility** and **ensure seamless** traffic flow, the initiative includes the deployment of an **intelligent traffic management** system, integrating real-time monitoring, advanced traffic signalization, and smart public transport stations equipped with passenger information panels. Additionally, a **high-efficiency LED** street lighting network will be implemented to improve visibility and contribute to energy efficiency. Beyond its immediate impact on congestion mitigation, this project is expected to **significantly enhance road safety**, reduce accident risks, and improve travel times, reinforcing Cluj-Napoca's commitment to sustainable urban development.



The academic community's interest in advancing their infrastructure for future development is well seen, as the most active project calls target developments in terms of educational infrastructure.





Rodna (Bistriţa-Năsăud County) is taking a strategic step toward inclusive and future-oriented education through a €1.95 million investment, co-financed by the 2021-2027 North-West Regional Programme. The project supports the extension, modernisation, and equipment of the Florian Porcius Vocational School.

The investment will result in the construction of two new school buildings, including six classrooms and four technical workshops, fully equipped to deliver practical, labour market-relevant training for students in the professional and technical education stream. The new facilities will accommodate up to 190 students, while introducing dual-education structures tailored to evolving sectoral needs.


Designed with accessibility, energy efficiency, and digital readiness in mind, the new infrastructure will provide safe, inclusive, and highquality learning environments. The project will help reduce school dropout rates, support transitions to higher education levels. and increase community trust in local public services. Set for completion in March of 2028, initiative reinforces commitment to preparing young people for the jobs of tomorrow, while offering scalable model for vocational education in rural and underserved areas across the region.



This priority marches for a Europe that is close to its citizens. It involves tenders promoting integrated and inclusive development across social, economic, and environmental domains, as well as culture, natural heritage, sustainable tourism, and security in non-urban areas.

The call for projects **714.B** - Urban regeneration and the security of public spaces has **14** signed contracts, showcasing the increased interest of the public sector beautify the cities to match the beauty of the community that inhabits each place.

A new EU-funded project under the North-West Regional Programme 2021-2027 will revitalize one of Cluj County's most important cultural landmarks: the Octavian Goga Museum Park in Ciucea. With an investment of over €7.3 million, the project supports rural tourism and cultural preservation through the integrated restoration and modernization of the park's infrastructure.

Located along the **E60 European road**, the historical estate is already a visible and accessible destination for travelers crossing the region. Through this investment, the site will benefit from a **full redesign of its landscape architecture**, new multifunctional areas for **cultural events**, **modern irrigation** and **lighting systems**, **digital connectivity**, and the rehabilitation of existing stone structures and forged iron fences. Architectural lighting and remote surveillance will also enhance safety and visitor experience across the park.

The project is expected to increase the annual number of visitors by 25%, reaching approximately 23,400 visitors per year. It also contributes to the implementation of an integrated 1-day cultural tourism route connecting Ciucea with the scenic Valea Drăganului and surrounding areas. Managed by Cluj County Council, the restoration covers over 1 hectare of landscaped parkland, including historical access paths, sculpted wooden gates, and the surrounding green infrastructure. The site will be equipped to host both real-life and digital tours, thanks to planned digitisation efforts. The investment is part of a broader strategy to promote heritage-based rural tourism across the North-West Region. With project completion set for January 2028, this project is set to become a flagship example of how EU funding can enhance cultural identity, local pride, and economic development in less developed areas.





Completed projects

A success story.

A major urban regeneration project has been successfully completed in Cluj-Napoca: the revitalisation of the Parcul Feroviarilor, a historic green space now fully modernised and reopened for public use. The investment was financed through the 2021-2027 North-West Regional Programme under Priority 7 - A more attractive region, supporting sustainable urban development.

With a total budget of over €13 million, the project has transformed the former railway park into a vibrant public space for recreation, culture, and community interaction. The design includes integrated green areas, new footpaths, upgraded access to the Someş River, and facilities for public events, making the park a model for climate-resilient and inclusive urban development.

Over **44,700 residents** are expected to benefit directly from access to the upgraded infrastructure, while more than **286,000 people** fall within the integrated territorial strategy covered by this urban intervention. Delivered in just **four months**, the project stands as a milestone of **fast and effective regeneration** under the new programming period.

The park is already recognised as an **international example of good practice** in sustainable placemaking. As of **May 2025**, the project is officially completed, with the **final implementation note submitted** and under review. Parcul Feroviarilor is now a **living proof** of how EU funds can **revitalise urban spaces** and **raise the quality of life**.
